Digital Storytelling Project

You and a partner will create a Microsoft Photo Story on a Greek god, goddess, hero, or creature. For the first week of the project you will research in the library media center during your language arts class where you will learn to take notes and cite your sources. From your notes, you will write a script for your Photo Story. For the second week of the project you will work on your Photo Story with your partner during your social studies class. You will finish your script, collect pictures, and record your Photo Story. Your finished project will be shown to your class so that we may all gain knowledge.

You are required to use one print source and one Internet source (World Book Online, FactCite or one of the bookmarked sites under Current Projects). While doing your research, you each will complete at least fifteen notecards, at least two source cards, and exactly five storyboards that you will use for your digital story.

You and your partner are each responsible for five slides for a total of eight storyboard slides. You will be responsible for either:

- Partner #1: One Introduction Slide and Four Topic Slides
- Partner #2: One Conclusion Slide and Four Topic Slides

Using MS Photo Story your partner and you will assemble your eight topic slides into a digital story explaining your Greek character. Your story should include pictures, text, and music. Each student will have a speaking role for his/her five slides.

Requirements:

- At least 15 notecards per person
- Works Cited Page
- At least 2 source cards per person
- 10 Slides Total
- **1 Introduction Slide:** Attention-getter, must attract audience and get them excited about your Greek character. Remember you want your audience to *want* to listen!
- **1 Closing Slide:** This is your last chance to convince your audience your character is interesting
