Checklists to Assess Student Understanding

Use the following checklists to assess student understanding following each session.

Session One:

- o Student's drawing shows more than one animal.
- o All animals are labeled with student phonetic spelling (or transcribed by adult).
- Drawings show the beginning, middle, and end of the story, with enough detail for the viewer to recognize the action/sequence.
- Writing matches what is shown in the pictures.
- o Drawings are colorful and detailed.

Session Two:

- o Student's justification is congruent with the story.
- o Student uses phonetic spelling.
- o Drawings are congruent with the writing.
- o Drawings are colorful and include visual details.

Session Three:

- o Student's response shows how the problem was solved.
- Student uses phonetic and appropriate spelling.
- o Drawing is congruent with the writing.
- o Drawing is colorful and detailed.

• Session Four:

- o Writing includes detail and responds appropriately to the prompt.
- o Student uses phonetic spelling and/or conventional spelling.
- o Writing is in complete sentences.
- o Drawings are colorful and show detail.



Session Five (Part 1):

- o Students' writing is a personal opinion and includes reference to the story.
- o Student uses a combination of conventional and phonetic spelling.
- o Writing is in complete sentences.
- o Drawings are congruent with the writing.
- o Drawings are colorful and detailed.

Session Five (Part 2):

- o Comparisons and/or contrasts are accurate.
- o Use of Venn Diagram is accurate.
- o Writing describes similarity or difference with detail.
- o Student uses conventional and phonetic spelling, as appropriate.
- o Writing is in complete sentences.
- o Drawing is congruent with writing.
- o Drawing is colorful and includes detail.
