Sample Treasure Hunt

Places to hide clues are in italics. Modify these places to fit your particular setting, then change the font back to roman (normal). The hiding places should <u>not</u> be in italics in the final version, because the clues would then be too obvious.

- 1. I started my day today by eating a dead rat I found on the ground next to a picnic table.
- 2. Since someone came to clean the table, I had to leave. I flew over to where there are some beautiful purple Bougainvilleas growing up a stone wall. There I noticed a dog sleeping, but he ran away when I got too close.
- 3. Then I decided to sit on the lowest branch of a large oak tree. Several other birds were there too, admiring my bald head. My head is devoid of feathers because it gets blood and other fluids on it from the dead animals I eat, and I like to keep it clean.
- 4. I did a little flying around, looking for more prey without luck. One of the humans below spotted me and started pointing and staring. Since my species is found in every continent except Antarctica and Oceania, humans always seem to know who I am, and they think what I eat is disgusting.
