Possible Score	Requirements
6	You will earn 6 points if you tell 4 events that happened in the story and you say what you liked or did not like about the story.
5	You will earn 5 points if you tell 4 events that happened in the story but you forget to say what you liked or did not like about the story.
4	You will earn 4 points if you tell 3 events that happened in the story. You will get an extra $\frac{1}{2}$ point if you tell what you liked or did not like about the story.
3	You will earn 3 points if you tell 2 events that happened in the story. You will get an extra $\frac{1}{2}$ point if you tell what you liked or did not like about the story.
2	You will earn 2 points if you only tell 1 event that happened in the story. You will get an extra $\frac{1}{2}$ point if you tell what you liked or did not like about the story.
1	You will earn 1 point if you only tell what you liked or did not like about the story and do not tell what happened. (For example, "The story was funny," "I liked it," "Junie B. Jones is silly.")
0	You will not earn any points if you forget what happened and you do not say if you liked or did not like the story.
