



Literature Circles with Film Roles –Storyboard Artist

In a film, the storyboard artist (sometimes called the graphic designer) puts ideas of others in the crew in to reality by creating artwork for the production.

Your job is to draw the meaning of this part of the story or to create a summary using pictures. Your project can be a sketch, cartoon, diagram, flow chart, or stick figure scene. Any kind of drawing/ graphic is fine, and you are welcome to use words as labels.

When it is your turn, share your illustration with the group. Invite the students to connect the drawing to their own ideas about the reading. Then you can share what your picture means, where it came from, or what it represents to you.
